

Professor Cezary W. Włodarczyk

Dr. Włodarczyk is a head of the Health Policy and Management Department (since 1996), Institute of Public Health (IPH), Health Related Sciences Faculty, Jagiellonian University, Cracow, Poland. Currently he serves as the Director of IPH. He also provides lectures and academic and tutorial duties at Faculty of Law and Administration, University of Lodz. Dr Włodarczyk holds degrees in Law (MA - 1970), Management (Ph.D.) from Warsaw University - 1977, Social Policy (habilitated doctor - 1989) from Academy of Economics in Katowice and professorship (economics - 2001). His areas of interests include mostly health policy and politics in the context of social policy and social sciences, as well as different aspects of public health. He has tried to consider contributions from philosophy, economic sociology, sociology of health and illness, and other dimensions of social health. In his professional career Dr. Włodarczyk has served as a researcher for the Institute of Social Medicine, the Institute of Occupational Medicine, the National Centre for Health Economics and Management, for the Social Insurance Department. Since 1990 Dr. Włodarczyk served as principal investigator or researcher on a number of World Bank and PHARE funded research projects in the area of health care organisation, management and financing. Dr. Włodarczyk also served as professional officer for the WHO Regional Office in Copenhagen (1992-1993). He has also been involved in a number of projects concerning health system reforms in Poland and elsewhere. He has supervised more than ten doctoral degrees and many MA degrees. Dr. Włodarczyk has published and taught in the areas of his interests. He has authored five books and has been co-author or editor of four others. He published more than 200 papers and chapters in books. His the most recent book is devoted to selected problems of health policy and politics (2014).
